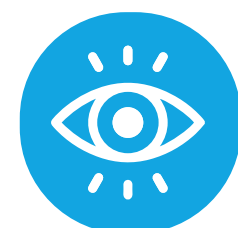

The Institute wants a world where all people are free to decide whether to have children or not. Where they are free to decide how many children to have and when to have them, and are free to have a healthy sex life, without the fear of unwanted pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections, including HIV.



INPPARES is a member of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF), which makes us part of a civil society movement that is locally owned and globally connected. We offer and facilitate services, and fight for the sexual health and reproductive rights of all people, especially those most marginalized.

Strategic Priorities

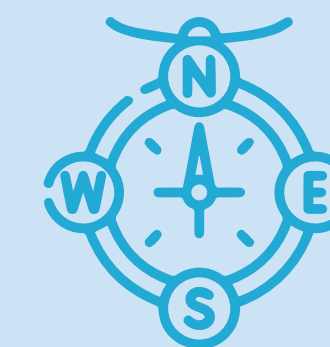
1 Increase people's access to health care services and supplies, with an emphasis on their sexual and reproductive health.

Network of Teachers:

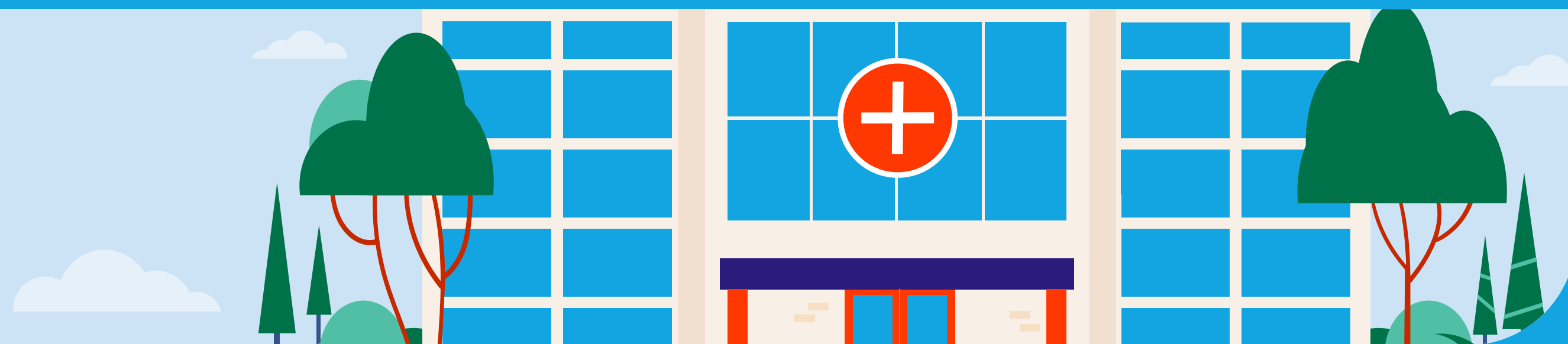
The "Network of teachers for Comprehensive Sexuality Education" trains and sensitizes teachers in Peru on the importance of Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE) as a cross-cutting framework for the development of society. The initiative has developed a program that strengthens teacher's knowledge and consolidates a national network of teachers committed to CSE, who mobilize in an organized and consistent manner in favour of the implementation of CSE into the national school curriculum.

Rights from the start:

Executed with funding from Global Affairs Canada (GAC). The project improves access to comprehensive sexual and reproductive health (SRH) services, including safe and legal abortion and post-abortion care for young women, especially adolescents, while ensuring the fulfilment of sexual and reproductive rights in selected districts of Lima.

Health Services

We facilitate access to quality medical services, specialising in sexual and reproductive health.

Youth Friendly Services

We have an integrated health model, where young people can access youth friendly services for their physical, sexual, and emotional health needs with specialised staff and clinics. Our Future Youth Centre trained 1,422 new youth advocates on sexual and reproductive health between 2016 and 2020.



Advocacy

We are strengthening a wave of favourable public opinion on sexual and reproductive health and rights through engagement with decision-makers, the media, politicians, and the general population. We emphasize the defence of the rights of vulnerable populations and the right of women to decide.



Social Projects

From our inception, we have developed projects for communities in situations of poverty and limited social protection, facilitating access and education on issues of sexual and reproductive health for adolescents and youth. The projects can be consulted at:

Inppares' Impact 2016 – 2020

- 2,174,781 provision of sexual health and reproductive health services.
- 262,126 access to contraceptive services.
- 97,101.83 couple of years of protection (CYP).
- 547,443 sexual health and reproductive health services for young persons.
- 333,182 STI and HIV services.
- 17,689 youth empowered with access to Comprehensive Sexuality Education.

Caring for Women Now Project

This project aims to reduce morbidity and mortality related to unwanted pregnancy and unsafe abortion through access to family planning services, counselling, and virtual accompaniment.

One of the achievements of this project is reflected in the fact that

84%

of counselled women accepted a modern birth control method.

Adaptation to the health emergency

Amidst the health crisis caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, INPPARES, together with other civil society organisations, advocated for the importance of sexual and reproductive health to be considered as a priority health service. These actions had a positive impact on the emergency decrees issued by the Government. Likewise, our social networks were consolidated as transmitters of sexual and reproductive health information.
